Executive and International Programs at the Goldman School of Public Policy and the Center for International Studies at the Colegio de México University have partnered to offer an annual course for public officials and other public policy professionals entitled, "U.S.– Mexico: Institutions and Public Policy Compared."

The course will be taught at the Colegio de México University in Mexico City over seven weekend sessions of nine hours each beginning on April 19th and closing on July 14th 2001. Professors from UC Berkeley, the Colegio de México University and special guests from the Mexican government and non-governmental organizations will instruct the classes.

Course Objective

The close and intense relations following the passage of the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) have accentuated the importance of having U.S. and Mexican public officials understand the political and institutional contexts of both countries. This diploma course is directed at training policy makers involved in U.S. – Mexican relations or in designing policies that transcend national borders. The course attempts to disseminate the most current research on political institutions and policy processes in Mexico and the United States. It provides participants with the political and institutional context of the decision-making environment in their neighboring country so that they may increase the effectiveness of their own policy design and enhance cooperation between both countries.
